- Examine how you spend your time




VCE Study Tip 03 - Managing Pressure

- Set time limits




- Timed practice exams

VCE Study Tip 06 - How to be relax & Study Calm


- Relax and be positive

- Understand the concepts and topics, Don't just memorise it




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- Choose a comfortable location to study

- Remember to do more practice exams

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












- Be flexible create a study timetable and stick to it

- Reward yourself when completed




VCE Study Tip 14 - Sleeping tips for exam success

- Survey Survey the textbook & chapters
- Question Start with a question
- Read Read actively
- Recite Respond to your question
- Review Record and Review your notes



VCE Study Tip 18 - How to memorise facts easily

- Read through all the major headings and sub headings in your chosen topic or sub topic
- Identify the most important section of the topic
- Take a time to understand what you will be committing to memorise
- Verbal recitation explaining materials in your own words and out loud
- Read your chosen topic or subtopic out loud and rephrase in your own words



VCE Study Tip 19 - Effective approach to questions

- At least read the questions 3 times
- Assume that all the information in the scenario is for a reason
- Read all the choices for multiple choice questions
- Eliminate the answer that are incorrect
- Do not leave a multiple choice questions unanswered



VCE Study Tip 20 - How to perpare bound reference

- Labelling your pages to identify easily
- Attaching tabs or separators
- Topic & summaries are very convenient
- Highlight the important sections of the area
- Organising the bound refernce according to chapters
- You can prepare bound refrence by typing or handwritten




VCE Study Tip 21 - How to nail VCE

- Be creative with your note taking and create winning study habits
- Giving yourself a break and balance your work accordingly with studies
- Take your time in the exam. If you're feeling overwhelmed, just close your eyes and give yourself a 30 second breathe.
- Think out of the box help you maximise grade score




VCE Study Tip 22 - Exam Preparation

- Practice past papers
- Read all questions carefully
- Manage your time for the questions
- Organise your ideas and facts
- Build up your answers
- Review the answers thoroughly



- Make sure you bring right equipments to the exam (pen, pencil, approved calculator, bound reference and ruler)
- Understand the instructions
- Identify the keywords
- Make sure include mathematical reasoning or calculations in your answer
- Set out your work in a logical manner. Clearly write each step of the solution



- Do not round the answer untill you obtain the final answer
- Checking for decimal places, significant figures and units
- If you stuck in a question, please move on and come back to it
- Always keep spare time to double check your answers



VCE Study Tip 25 - How to perpare for the English exam

- Read the VCCA past examination reports which are relevant to new study design
- Plan responses for lots of sample topics
- Analyse previous essays and hightlight key points
- Gather relevant information for the topics
- Practice!! Practice!! Practice!!



VCE Study Tip 26 - Final days before the Exam

- Pinpoints the areas of the chapters and focus on them
- Read summary notes
- Focus on your weakest areas
- Have a nutritious and healthy meal
- Organise your exam day

VCE Study Tip 28 - During the exam

- Read the questions Carefully
- Read and Understand the Instructions thoroughly
- Decide which order you will answer questions
- If you stuck on a question mark it, move on to the next and come back to it at the end
- Keep track of the time during the exam and make sure keep enough time to double check the answers



VCE Study Tip 29 - The day before the exam

- Stick with your study plan
- Revise Recite the main Points on each topic, check your recall against your exam notes or flash cards
- Pack your bag Ensure that you have packed all the stationary items
- Set yourself up for a good night rest
- Avoid drinks containing caffeine




